



Begin with FamilySearch.Org for providing preliminary assistance to Patrons


- Have patron sign in to their FamilySearch.Org account
- Go to the Help link:




Go to the Getting Started Pull Down Menu. There are excellent beginning advice about where to guide
individuals on both temple work and doing original research for documents as found
on FamilySearch.Org. For example, birth, marriage, residence and death records. Note: there are several
videos and tutorials also included.




• Go to **Search** and click on **Records** for doing preliminary record searches:




• For more resources available, to the **Learning Center** menus available and there are a myriad of specialized tutorials available, including "Beginning Research and "Getting Started in Genealogy." This section also branches out with international tutorials by country.




• For more extensive research with foreign countries, microfilms, microfiche and specialized publications, go to the **Catalog** section of **Search** for extensive resources.



• It is realistic that some patrons will need more specialized assistance that <u>FamilySearch.Org</u> doesn't immediately provide. Fortunately, the Church has relationships with <u>Ancestry.Com</u>, <u>Find My Past</u>, and <u>My Heritage</u> that can be accessed directly from the patron's individual ancestor on their family tree that takes that ancestor directly to these other web site with that ancestor is already listed for your further researching. The example below is for my mother, <u>Helen Marie Kovac</u>, and encircled are links to these other companion websites that the Church has affiliation with and when you click on any one of them, my mother will be listed there for further research investigations.
